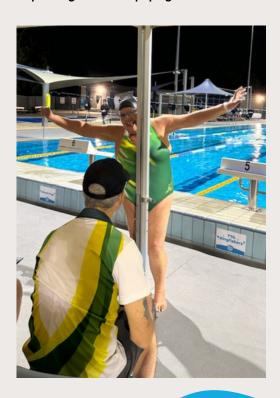

The sessions following the J2J where focused on initially recovery then harder efforts involving mixed strokes, descending time intervals and some sprints.
